OCC Pre-Budget Consultations ELIMINATE DEFICIT AND REDUCE DEBT

An 'Open Letter' to Ontario Finance Minister Charles Sousa with Budget recommendations

The Ontario Chamber of Commerce (OCC) is pleased to
have this opportunity to present our recommendations to
you as you craft the 2015 Ontario Budget.

Your government must take steps to improve the business climate in the province. We are increasingly concerned with how new provincial programs and policies are impacting Ontario's competitiveness and job creation. Over the past year, the Government of Ontario has implemented or announced several new initiatives that have a direct impact on business, including increases to minimum wage, a new *Waste Diversion Act*, a review of the *Labour Relations Act*, the *Ontario Retirement Pension Plan* (ORPP), and a potential carbon pricing regime. Government needs to seriously consider the cumulative impact of these initiatives on business.

Addressing the fiscal situation should also continue to be top priority for government. Eliminating the deficit is an important step your government can take to improve Ontario's competitiveness and create jobs in the province.

As it stands, the province spends \$10.6 billion on interest charges to service its debt. That's money that could be invested in infrastructure, education, or other productivity-enhancing measures. Worryingly, the amount Ontario spends on interest charges will increase as our debt grows over the coming years and as interest rates inevitably rise.

This document outlines seven key recommendations that we believe the Government of Ontario must adopt in order to return to fiscal balance and spur growth in our economy.

CITY TARGETS 170+ RURAL LANDSCAPERS

Planning Department: Provincial Greenbelt dictates that over 90 percent of rural landscapers are illegal

The 'new' Hamilton has approximately 180 landscaping businesses - most of them located in rural Flamborough. But according to the city's Planning Department, only about 10 have the required 'site specific' zoning. So

what will that mean for the other 170 landscaping businesses?

The Planning Department is developing a 'Rural Zoning ByLaw' which - if adopted - will confirm that these rural landscape businesses are not zoned properly.

The Planning Department argues that it's hands are tied as local zoning bylaws must 'conform with' or 'be consistent with' provincial policies and legislation. Specifically, staff claims the Greenbelt leaves the city no choice.

Proposed changes regarding property zoning in rural Flamborough was the focus at a recent meeting organized by Councillors Judi Partridge (below, speaking) of Ward 15 (East Flamborough) and Robert Pasuta (below, left) of Ward 14 (West Flamborough) at the Harry Howell Arena at Clappison's Corners. Flamborough Chamber of Commerce (FCC) Executive Director Arend Kersten (below, right) moderated the discussion. General Manager Jason Thorne of Hamilton's Planning and Economic Development Department (above, speaking) brought along senior members of his team (above, seated at right) to provide an explanation of the proposed changes and answer questions. Particularly disconcerting are the impacts the changes will have especially on landscapers and the owners of 'industrial' properties in rural Flamborough.



The Greenbelt legislation is currently under review - and Ward 14 (West Flamborough) Councillor Robert Pasuta has arranged an urgent meeting with Ancaster-Dundas-Flamborough-Westdale MPP Ted McMeekin, the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing in Premier Kathleen Wynne's Liberal Cabinet.

The new proposals will be considered by the city's Planning Committee at two special sessions on Tuesday, March 31. Those impacted by the proposals are urged to not only attend but also to present their concerns. The FCC has already registered with the city to share its thoughts.

Any decision made by the Planning Committee (chaired by Ward 15 - East Flamborough -Councillor Judi Partridge) must subsequently be ratified by the entire Hamilton Council.

"For the most part, these are 'salt of the earth' folks," argues Flamborough Chamber of Commerce (FCC) Executive Director Arend Kersten. "They work hard, they pay their taxes, they provide local employment opportunities, they are committed to their families and communities. And they are not a drain on the city's social services or police budgets.

'Why the city wants to drive these businesses out of Hamilton baffles me," Kersten added. "Especially when there is such a dire need for new commercial and industrial tax assessment in Hamilton to address the significant fiscal challenges the city is facing.'

AND THE SURVEY SAYS:

IT'S GOOD FOR BUSINESS TO JOIN THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE

Advocates of chambers of commerce have long believed that when a company is active in its local chamber, it is doing the right thing not only for the community but for its own success as well. While there is plenty of evidence to show the impact of chambers of commerce on their communities, it is much harder to find data that quantify the impact of belonging to a chamber.

A recent study, commissioned by the American Chamber of Commerce Executives, is designed to do just that: determine the real value to companies in terms of consumer outcomes of joining and being active in their local chamber of commerce. Do consumers really support businesses because they are chamber members?

Data for the study come from a scientific web-based survey of 2,000 adults nationwide. What makes the study unlike most, however, is that almost every question on it

is part of one of several imbedded experi-

This means that respondents were randomly assigned to different groups at several points during the survey. Each group reads something slightly different - like a groups answered the same questions, we know exactly why it happened.

This approach yields powerful results because it bypasses the subjectivity of most opinion polls. A sampling of some of these results proves this to be the case.

When consumers know that a small business is a member of the chamber of commerce, they are 44% more likely to think favorably of it and 63% more likely to purchase goods or services from the company in the future.

• Most consumers (59%) think that being active in the local chamber of commerce is an effective business strategy overall. It is 29% more effective, however, for communicating to consumers that a company uses good business practices and 26%

more effective for communicating that a business is reputable.

- If a company shows that it is highly involved in its local chamber (e.g., sits on the chamber board), consumers are 12% more likely to think that its products stack up better against its competition.
- When a consumer thinks that a company's products stack up better against the competition because the company is highly involved in its local chamber of commerce, it is because he or she infers that the company is trustworthy, involved in the community, and is an industry leader.
- · When consumers know that a restaurant franchise is a member of the chamber of commerce, they are 40% more likely to eat at the franchise in the next few months.
- When consumers know that an insurance company is a member of the chamber of commerce, they are 43% more likely to consider buying insurance from it.



CCC IDENTIFIES 'TOP 10 BARRIERS' TO 2015 COMPETITIVENESS

Either Canada acts urgently to improve its competitiveness or the country will pay a high price in lost jobs and prosperity.

Three years ago, the Canadian Chamber of Commerce (CCC) launched its *Top 10 Barriers to Competitiveness*. In collaboration with its network of chambers of commerce and boards of trade (including the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce), the CCC has been drawing attention to the barriers that are holding back Canada's progress and has been urging all levels of government to act more swiftly to improve our country's ability to compete globally.

Earlier this month, the CCC unveiled its *Top 10 Barriers to Competitiveness for 2015*. Some of the issues (see below) are new while others have been on the list since the beginning.

"Since launching this initiative, we have made great progress in furthering our competiveness agenda on a number of issues. However, the barrier our members continue to identify as being the greatest impediment to the success of Canadian business is the skills gap," said CCC President and CEO Perrin Beatty. "There is a lot of work ahead. The federal government and several provincial and territorial governments have also

named this issue as the country's biggest challenge. We need to work together and make real progress in 2015. "

Addressing the *Top 10 Barriers to Competitiveness* will go a long way towards restoring Canada's competitiveness. The CCC is calling on its own membership, on governments, on educators, on labour organizations and others to tackle and overcome these barriers. Effectively addressing these 10 barriers will sharpen Canada's competitive edge and allow us to prosper in the global economy.

"Tolerating these barriers, or self-inflicted wounds as we call them, is not an option," concluded Beatty. "The challenge for 2015 is to build on this progress and start closing the gap between Canadian businesses and our international competitors.

Ontario Chamber of Commerce

SURVEY: PENSION PLAN = FEWER EMPLOYEES

A new survey of businesses from the Ontario Chamber of Commerce (OCC) shows that the implementation of the Ontario Retirement Pension Plan (ORPP) could have negative consequences for employment.

The OCC survey was conducted in late January and early February 2015 and had 1,136 participants.

The survey indicates that only 26 percent of businesses in the province believe they can shoulder the financial burden associated with the ORPP. If faced with mandatory increased contributions under the ORPP, 44 percent of surveyed businesses indicate that they would reduce their current payroll or hire fewer employees in the future.

In light of these findings, the CCC is calling on the Ontario Liberal government of Premier Kathleen Wynne to reconsider its proposed approach to boosting Ontarians' retirement savings and assess the extent to which the implementation of the ORPP will negatively impact Ontario's economy.

"Businesses consistently tell us that they cannot afford this new, mandatory cost on top of rising electricity prices and other cost pressures," says OCC President and CEO Allan O'Dette.

"To provide clarity to the business community and the public around the potential impact on jobs, investment, and the broader economy, the government must conduct a comprehensive and publicly available economic analysis of the new pension plan before it moves forward with implementation."

The ORPP, which aims to boost Ontarians'

retirement savings, will require employers to match employee contributions to the new plan. Employers that provide defined benefit pension plans will be exempt from these contributions, but the majority of employers in Ontario will have to pay into the ORPP, regardless of the retirement savings plans they currently provide to their employees.

In a recent submission to the Government of Ontario, the OCC points to evidence that the vast majority of Canadians are on-track to maintain their standard of living in retirement and that the ORPP will punish employers and employees who are already contributing to their secure retirement future through non-defined benefit workplace retirement savings plans.

"The ORPP is a blanket solution to a problem that requires a targeted approach," adds O'Dette. "A better approach would be to target the minority of households that are undersaving, like Pooled Registered Pension Plans."

The OCC is concerned that the ORPP could cause employers to reduce their contributions to offset the new cost, or scrap their existing plans altogether.

"Employers that already offer viable workplace retirement savings plans, like defined contribution pension plans and group RRSPs, should not have to pay into the new pension plan, O'Dette added.

"Let's focus the solution on the group of people who really need a boost in their future retirement income."
