

Schools, parks, and the yards of local organizations were cleaned up and beautified with plants and flowers. Some schools had fresh lines painted on the playground tarmac. The basement area at Drummond House was transformed into a children's play land. Local senior citizens were visited and many had projects done in their homes. bikes were repaired free of charge, while dozens of boxes of food were collected for Flamborough food bank. Bags of clothes were donated and sorted for "Helping Hands," a Hamilton street mission. Baskets of toiletries and supplies were donated to fill shelves at the Flamborough Women's Resource Centre. Bags of gently-used hockey equipment were gathered to be given to needy children.

What a tremendous response from Waterdown residents to work and serve this wonderful community.

The second half of the day was called "Celebrate Waterdown." During this time families enjoyed a free children's carnival. Eight creative bouncy inflatable castles and games entertained children for hours. Children challenged their skills with ten minigames, then received prizes aboard a real-life pirate ship. Teams challenged each other at a road hockey tournament as well as Frisbee golf. A soccer match between our local migrant workers and some of the community's VIP's came down to a shoot-out with our migrant workers edging out our Waterdown VIPs.

The air of Memorial Park was alive with the music of talented bands performing on the main stage. The food was amazing with a free BBQ, candy floss, snow cones, popcorn and icecream – all thorough enjoyed by over 600 people.

The inaugural Wild On Waterdown Day (WOW) was a great success, serving and celebrating Waterdown! Thanks to everyone who volunteered to make this day a great example of how the people of Waterdown work together: *ONE DAY – ONE VILLAGE – ONE HEART*!


