After 37 years in community programming, Cogeco's senior director of communications and programming, Maureen Tilson-Dyment, has called it a career.

A tireless worker and community

proponent, Tilson-Dyment began as a cable channel volunteer and her career culminated in a standing-room only retirement party at the company's Burlington headquarters which drew just about every community leader and politician from the region.

She has held a number of roles over the years and in her most current one, she was responsible for provincial community relations and information, media and government relations, company outreach and event programs, sponsorships and donations, and local advertising and promotions. She was also responsible for twenty-one local television stations operating under the TV COGECO brand in Ontario.

Cogeco CEO Louis Audet, who spoke at the event, called Tilson-Dyment "a person of exception" who oversaw local channels which aired programming "created with passion to reflect the community to itself," he said. In an emotional, funny speech, Cogeco vice-president Tom McCutcheon called Tilson-Dyment "Cogeco's main ambassador" while Bob Balint, senior director of operational support and planning, called her "a strong advocate for community television for Cogeco, and nationally."

Her work was recognized by the Canadian cable industry in 1997 when she

was presented with the CCTA Award of Excellence for outstanding contributions and industry leadership.

Tilson-Dyment has also been actively engaged with community committees such as Performing Arts Burlington and the Halton Round Table on Funding Matters, and is currently a member of the Hamilton Tiger Town Council, Canadian Women in Communications, president of the Board of TV Hamilton and a member of the Oakville Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors. She is a recipient of the Rotary Foundation Paul Harris Fellowship for her contributions to the community, as well.

When it was Tilson-Dyment's turn to speak, she said: "I've been called a missionary and I'm proud of it... What we're about is telling the stories of our communities. It's a privilege. It's a joy. Everybody has a point of view and wants to be heard. Everybody has a story."

THREE PRIORITIES FOR ADVANCING CHINA TIES

In a report released to coincide with Prime Minister Stephen Harper’s visit to China, the Canadian Chamber of Commerce (CCC) argues that Canada-China ties are quickly becoming one of Canada’s most important external relationships. Today, more than ever, what happens in China represents both a challenge and an opportunity for Canadian businesses.

“There is a clear need for more and better Canada-China trade,” said CCC President and CEO Perrin Beatty. “Of course, there are barriers in both countries that must be removed in order to open access to the tremendous opportunities ahead and build a partnership of shared growth and prosperity, but we cannot let these stop us from realizing the full benefits of the relationship.”

In the report entitled *Advancing Our Economic Ties With China: Three priorities for Canadian business*, the CCC presents three elements to making Canada’s relationship with China more profitable: (a) implementing a strategy of political engagement with China; (b) removing barriers and irritants to more trade and better trade with China; and, (c) improving the investment relationship with China.

There are opportunities for Canadian businesses to provide China with the goods and services it requires to sustain its own development. These include energy, raw materials, food, financial and engineering services, aerospace and transportation, and higher education.

There are also opportunities to plug into value chains-to provide expertise and business services to multinationals involved in trade and investment between China and the United States, China and India, China and Brazil, and so forth. Then, there are untapped opportunities to broaden Canada’s investment relationship with China by loosening restrictions on capital flows.

If Canadian businesses improve their productivity and innovation, if governments continue removing barriers to competitiveness in Canada and if the global competitive playing field is better levelled, Canada will prosper in its exchanges with China and the rest of Asia.

With 420 chambers of commerce/boards of trade across Canada (representing 192,000 companies), the CCC is the vital link between business and the federal government, helping to shape public policy and decision-making.
