


Characteristics of love, respect and accountability within the family results in enhanced and genuine communication.

IT'S GOOD FOR BUSINESS TO JOIN THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE Advocates of chambers of commerce

have long believed that when a company is active in its local chamber, it is doing the right thing not only for the community but for its own success as well. While there is plenty of evidence to show the impact of chambers of commerce on their communities, it is much harder to find data that quantify the impact of belonging to a chamber.

A recent study, commissioned by the American Chamber of Commerce Executives, is designed to do just that: determine the real value to companies in terms of consumer outcomes of joining and being active in their local chamber of commerce. Do consumers really support businesses because they are chamber members?

Data for the study come from a scientific web-based survey of 2,000 adults nationwide. What makes the study unlike most, however, is that almost every question on it

is part of one of several imbedded experiments.

This means that respondents were randomly assigned to different groups at several points during the survey. Each group reads something slightly different - like a groups answered the same questions, we know exactly why it happened.

This approach yields powerful results because it bypasses the subjectivity of most opinion polls. A sampling of some of these results proves this to be the case.

When consumers know that a small business is a member of the chamber of commerce, they are 44% more likely to think favorably of it and 63% more likely to purchase goods or services from the company in the future.



[∞] Ontario Chamber of Commerce **PROVINCE ADDRESSES CONCERNS RE ONTARIO PENSION PLAN**

BOTTOM LINE - OCTOBER, The Government of Ontario is planning to move ahead with its plans to implement a new pension scheme for the province. The Ontario Retirement Pension Plan (ORPP) will require employers to match additional employee contributions of 1.9 percent of their income, up to a maximum income level of \$90,000.

A recent letter signed by representatives of more than 50 chambers of commerce/boards of trade from all parts of Ontario (including the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce) to MPP Mitzie Hunter - the Minister responsible for the implementing the plan - expressed deep concern about the ORPP and its potential impact on business. Specifically, the letter included questions (which were published in the Bottom Line last month and can be found on the FCC website).

Minister Hunter recently participated in a special network teleconference, during which many OCC members shared concerns and questions about the ORPP. It appears the OCC message about the ORPP is resonating at Queen's Park. Minister Hunter has shown an eagerness to engage with the Chamber network on this file.

The goal of the OCC network is to continue a productive and constructive engagement with Minister Hunter and the government so that the concerns of members are known and understood.

After the recent teleconference, Minister Hunter provided the following answers to the questions raised in the OCC network letter.

1. Instead of creating its own pension plan, why can't the province work with the federal government to enhance the Canada Pension Plan (CPP)? This would avoid administrative duplication and is a preferred option for businesses, when compared to the Ontario Retirement Pension Plan.

Enhancing the CPP remains the preferred option for the Government of Ontario. Despite ours and other provincial government's best efforts, the federal government decided to shut down consideration of a modest enhancement to the Canada Pension Plan. Their decision is disappointing, given the growing retirement income challenge faced by Canadians and Ontarians. As such, we are moving forward with a new mandatory provincial pension plan — the Ontario Retirement Pension Plan (ORPP) — that would be cost-effective, responsible, and designed to meet the needs of a 21st century workforce. The ORPP would expand pension coverage initially to more than three million working

Ontarians who currently rely on the CPP, OAS, and their own savings for retirement income. It would build on the key features of the CPP, and could later be integrated with the CPP should negotiations on an enhancement be successful in the future. We are eager to consult with businesses and employees on how best to move forward with this plan.

2. Has the province done any kind of economic forecast as to the financial effect that the ORPP will have on Ontario's business community?

Answer: We have more work to do on that front and it is part of our Ministry's workplan. In April, David Dodge released a report on the need for pension enhancement and its impact on the economy. In that report, Dodge underscores that Canadian workers are far from saving enough to maintain a satisfactory standard of living. This creates pressure on our economy in a number of different ways, not the least of which is the negative impact this will continue to have on seniors' purchasing power. Dodge's report also found that any short term costs would be offset by positive longterm effects. Put simply, a higher savings rate today would mean greater income and consumption in the future.

3. How will the government treat businesses that cannot afford to match mandatory contributions under the ORPP (specifically, small businesses)? Will there be exemptions for small businesses?

Answer: We need to be sensitive to the impact that any pension reforms would have on small businesses. That's why we've designed the ORPP to be phased in gradually. Our timing is deliberate: the On tario Retirement Pension Plan would be introduced in 2017, coinciding with expected reductions in Employment Insurance premiums for employers and employees. Enrolment of employers and employees into the ORPP would occur in stages, beginning with the largest employers. Contribution rates would be phased in over two years.

4. The government has pledged to exempt those employees already participating in a comparable workplace pension plan from enrolling in the ORPP. What types of workplace pension plans will be considered "comparable" to the ORPP? What about Pooled Registered Pension Plans (PRPPs), will they be considered a "comparable plan"?

Answer: This is an area that we are actively considering and our technical advisory group, comprised of leading pension experts, is looking closely at the notion of comparable plans. This is a significant policy question, and one for which we will seek business' input. In addition to the ORPP, voluntary savings mechanisms like PRPPs will play a big part in shoring up the retirement system. We have committed to introducing a framework for PRPPs.

5. How will the ORPP impact the selfemployed? Self-employed individuals often face a greater degree of income variability. While savings vehicles like the PRPP provide flexibility in terms of employer contributions, it is not clear that the ORPP would do the same.

Answer: We recognize the unique status of self-employed individuals. Self-employed individuals will be exempt from the ORPP. However, the government will consult to make sure we develop solutions that allow self-employed individuals to achieve a secure retirement future.

Canadian Chamber of Commerce CCC MEETS IN CHARLOTTETOWN

"We want to see real changes in the months ahead. Canadian business cannot continue to be held hostage to an archaic system."

The CCC network also reiterated its support for the Partnership for Resource Trade. The group, of which the CCC is a founding member, seeks to engage and mobilize Canadians on the key role the development of our natural resources play in the economic success of our nation. "All of us benefit when our natural resources are developed responsibly and brought to market successfully," stressed Beatty.
