The President Reports:

LAWYER APPOINTED TO FCC BOD

Kyle Hampson of Waterdown – a lawyer with Miller Thomson in its Guelph office – has been appointed to the Board of Directors (BOD) of the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce (FCC).

Kyle replaces FCC Past President Hal Bushey, the former Executive Director of CHOICES (Supporting Individuals with Developmental Disabilities) who resigned after accepting a senior management position with a not-for-profit organization located in another community.

At its Annual General Meeting (AGM) last September, members of the FCC approved bylaw changes that reduces the members of the BOD to nine (from 10) and calls for two consecutive 3-year terms (instead of two consecutive 2-year terms). The changes also allow the BOD to appoint replacement members to fill a vacancy created by resignations between AGM meetings. Under a new schedule, no less than one and no more than two of the nine members of the BOD – which meets monthly and

provides direction and support to staff – will complete their terms of office each year, thereby ensuring a 'regular turnover' with new faces, perspectives and experiences.

The other members of the FCC BOD are President Jason Small (Community Church); Vice President Penny Gardiner (EDAC – Economic Developers Association of Canada); Secretary Ron Graham (Lafarge Canada); Treasurer Graham Flint (FORCE – Friends of Rural Communities and the Environment); Teresa Luckanuck (Spoiled Rotten Pet Sitting & Dog Walking), Wendy Martin (Sutton About Town Real Estate); Greg Tremble (OLG Slots at Flamboro Downs); and, Wendy Wasylowich (Great Canadian Gaming Company – Flamboro Downs).

Penny and Graham will complete their terms of office in September and will need to be replaced. Kyle will complete Hal's term, which concludes in 2014. Kyle and his wife live in Waterdown and are the proud parents of an infant daughter.

YOUNG ENTREPRENEUR OF THE YEAR HONOURS MEMORY OF HER LATE BROTHER AT OBA GALA

What follows are comments prepared by Sarah Powell that were shared at the Outstanding Business Achievement (OBA) awards gala held at the Flamborough Hills Golf & Country Club in Copetown in early March. Sarah – of Sarah Grace Photography – was awarded the Young Entrepreneur of the Year Award by the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce at the OBA gala.

How do you learn to see beauty in the midst of life's struggles? How do you learn to capture the fleeting moments with your loved ones who make life on this fragile planet so special?

My love of photography was born out of a very dark time in my life. Three years ago, my oldest brother David was killed in a tragic car accident. To help us find joy again, my mom challenged my sister and me to put aside time every day to go outside with a camera to find and capture beauty in the world.

Over time, my mother was genuinely impressed with the images I had captured, and decided to encourage me in my newfound passion for photography. Soon, I found it hard to put the camera down. I set out to find beauty in everything and everyone.

With my very simple camera, I started doing photo shoots of friends and family, and discovered that I loved to photograph people. Within five minutes of making a Facebook page for my photography, I began to receive requests for sessions from potential clients. And so Sarah Grace Photography began and took off quickly.

I could not have done this without some wonderful mentors.

My mother, a former professional photographer and businesswoman herself, constantly supported me. Another invaluable help was the Summer Company Program for Young Entrepreneurs with the city of Hamilton and the mentorship of Dragica Lebo.

As well, some amazingly supportive professional photographers came alongside me with a lot of help and encouragement. Barb Uil, a world renowned children's photographer from Australia, endorsed my work on her Facebook page and was a huge encouragement to me personally.

I love my photography business because it allows me to capture the beauty I see in each person I photograph. Life flies by, and sometimes the really important things fall by the wayside. It is wonderful when families decide to get beautiful portraits done of each stage in their family's growth, when they capture those moments and memories forever.

The photos of my brother David are amongst my family's most treasured possessions, but when we took them, we had no idea that we would never be given the chance to photograph him laughing with us again.

My business has continued to grow. My calendar is already booking up for this spring and summer, and I have finally started to accept weddings. I look forward to continuing to grow as a photographer in my creative abilities, and as a business owner. Through my photography, I continue to attempt to capture beauty in this world.

As well, I look for ways to spread life through my business.

Hours before he died, my brother David wrote as his Facebook status: "I want to run, jump, and spread life in this world." Each year, on his birthday, our family honours his memory by challenging people to do random acts of kindness in his name.

This year, I ran a special contest to honour someone who had had a difficult year, and the winner was a young woman who had lost her father. It has been one of my goals with Sarah Grace Photography to continue to spread the life that David spread in this world before he left

It is my hope that in the years to come, I will stretch my business beyond what I ever considered possible and never stop trying to capture the beauty which I see in this world.

IF IT AIN'T BROKE

Valuable political lesson in 'slots and trots' crises

When one looks at the 'double whammy' crises facing the Flamborough economy as a result of changes to the province's 'slots and trots' programs, the phrase "If it ain't broke ... don't fix it" comes to mind.

The unexpected end of the province's \$345 million annual partnership with Ontario's horse racing industry has already had a dramatic impact on Flamborough's economy. Listen to how one person describes it in a recent Letter to the Editor to the *Flamborough Review*: "Already, irreparable damage has been done. Breedings have dropped significantly, as have yearling sales. There have been hundreds

of jobs lost, homes sold, families and stables relocated and lives ruined. It has been one hellish year filled with emotions some of us never knew existed."

Then there's the uncertainly surrounding the future of the OLG slots at Flamboro Downs. Granted, a recent 5-year extension of the lease agreement

with Flamboro Downs (with its extraordinary record of success and located withing a 'willing host' community) has brought a 'stay of execution' for the hundreds of employees whose jobs are at stake. But it's only that – a stay of execution. It guarantees absolutely nothing.

It is hard to comprehend why former Premier Dalton McGuinty and former Finance Minister Dwight Duncan would set out to jeopardize a vibrant industry complete with 60,000 direct and indirect jobs and an annual \$1.1 billion contribution to the province's economy.

To her credit, Kathleen Wynne – Ontario's new Liberal premier and the current Minister of Agriculture and Food – acknowledged in early March at the annual *Outstanding Business Achievement Awards Gala* hosted by the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce that the 'slots and trots' issues could have been handled better. I couldn't agree more.

Both Premier Wynne and Ancaster-Dundas-Flamborough-Westdale MPP Ted Mc-Meekin – the former Minister of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs in the McGuinty Cabinet and now the Minister of Community and Social Services in the Wynne Cabinet – have vowed that a sustainable horse racing industry would continue in Ontario, albeit at a much smaller scale.

But the devil is always in the details – and few details have been released.

Is it too little, too late? Whether the glass is half full or half empty depends entirely on your personal perspective.

What is clear is that there's a universal lesson here for all politicians of all stripes at all levels: If it ain't broke ... don't fix it!

INTEREST ARBITRATION IS HURTING OUR COMMUNITIES

In light of the recent controversy regarding the budget for the Hamilton, Police Services, the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce (FCC) shares the position of the Ontario Chmaber of Commerce (OCC) on the matter.

What is interest arbitration?

Interest arbitration is a mechanism used to renew or establish a new collective agreement for parties without the right to strike. It is the only legal process for municipalities to settle contract negotiation disputes with essential municipal workers, such as police, firefighters and some paramedics.

Why does it matter?

Interest arbitration decisions give little consideration to local fiscal realities. Instead, arbitrators tend to replicate agreements from other communities. This is problematic. Replicating the salary and benefits from Toronto, for example, to Haliburton, doesn't consider the differences in communities' capacity to pay.

Partially as a result of interest arbitration, emergency service costs are growing more quickly than the Consumer Price Index as well as the average of other public sector workers, including nurses and teachers. High interest arbitration awards mean municipalities are forced to either

increase taxes and/or reduce services.

Competitive tax rates and quality public services are key to economic development and prosperity. Interest arbitration is hurting municipalities' economic competitiveness and ultimately hurting the competitiveness of the province.

What needs to change?

Both the Commission on the Reform of Ontario's Public Services and the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) have done extensive research into the interest arbitration system. Both agree that there is significant room for improvement. The Ontario Chamber of Commerce (OCC) supports the following changes:

- The 'ability to pay' criteria used in interest arbitration decisions should be broadened to include economic and fiscal environment, and productivity criteria;
- Arbitrators should be required to provide clear assessments and reasons for their decisions;
- Arbitrators must give priority to, and provide clear, written explanations of how the fiscal health of a community was considered when making a deci-
- Streamline the process by providing interest arbitrators one year to complete their work.
