AGM THEME: 'A CANADA THAT WORKS'

The theme for this year's Canadian Chamber of Commerce (CCC) Annual General Meeting (AGM) was "A Canada that Works." The theme carried through the entire conference as speakers and panelists all grappled with the challenges facing us today and in the near future.

The Honourable Jason Kenney, Minister of Citizenship, Immigration and Multiculturalism reminded us that Canada has been recognized as the best place to start a business. He advised that we have the highest per capita level of immigration but acknowledged that it doesn't always work. The government and businesses alike have to demonstrate to Canadians that immigration can work and it is in fact a key strategy for solving our labour shortage.

Minister Kenney did not rule out domestic solutions to this labour shortage and spoke of reducing the dis-incentives around Employment Insurance (EI). For example, he addressed recent changes to EI where individuals must be willing to accept a job at their skill level in their local community or risk being denied EI benefits.

Let me share a couple of interesting facts:

- Canada has a 14% youth unemployment rate in an economy with a labour shortage.
- The unemployment rate for immigrants is twice as high as that for domestic Canadians.

We bring immigrants here with the promise of a job equivalent to their skill level yet they end up working in "survival" jobs. We need to be able to connect immigrants to jobs BEFORE they arrive. We need to get businesses involved in the recruitment of immigrants.

Colleges and universities are inviting students to Canada to study at an increasing rate year over year. We allow them to stay and work for a year ... and then they either have to return home or are placed at the end of the 7-year immigration line. Yet we need their skills. Changes will be made in January 2013 to fast track these students when employers guarantee

CCC President and CEO Perrin Beatty agreed there is no one solution to the labour shortage and challenged each community to look for tailored solutions. Resources must be mobilized from public, private, provincial, federal and local agencies. He strongly emphasized the role education must play. Essential skills are an issue in Canada - employees are not job ready. Educational institutions need to step up. But so do employers. Canadian businesses under invest in the education of their employees, lagging behind every other major country in the world.

RISING PUBLIC SECTOR LABOUR COSTS

On Thursday September 20, 2012, Ontario Minister of Finance Dwight Duncan announced a cap on compensation for managers in the Ontario Public Service (OPS) and the Broader Public Service (BPS).

The Ontario Chamber of Commerce (OCC) is supportive of the newly announced cap on compensation and is on record in calling for a long-term public sector compensation restraint

Any serious plan to return to fiscal balance in the medium-term must address Ontario's labour costs.

As it stands, the Ontario government spends roughly 50 cents of every taxpayer dollar on salaries and benefits for workers in the broader public sector. That represents roughly \$55 billion annually.

The government also needs to look at other ways to reduce costs including allowing businesses more opportunities to deliver services. The OCC is currently studying this issue and will be releasing recommendations in early 2013 on how the government can do just that.

PROVINCIAL ECONOMIC OUTLOOK

On Monday, October 15, Ontario Finance Minister Dwight Duncan presented his latest 'economic outlook.' What follows are some of the highlights:

- The projected deficit for 2012-13 is \$14.4 billion, down \$400 million from the 2012 Budget forecast.
- The deficit is set to be eliminated by 2017-18, as previously forecast.
- Ontario's debt is now \$272 billion, up from \$257.5 billion last spring.
- Ontario's economy will continue to grow at a moderate pace. Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is expected to grow by 2.0 percent in 2012; 1.9 percent in 2013; 2.3 percent in 2014; and, 2.4 percent in 2015.

What follows are some 'key messages' from the OCC:

- Ontario's large debt (\$272 billion) and deficit (\$14.4 billion) threaten On- dor. tario's economic recovery.
- The OCC urges the government to return to fiscal balance.
- In spite of the challenges posed by its minority status in the legislature, the government must pursue aggressive cost-cutting measures. This includes a much-needed broader public sector wage freeze.
- Returning to fiscal health is only half the battle. The government must also find creative ways to grow the economy.
- The OCC network which includes the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce (FCC) - has produced Emerging Stronger, an economic vision that identifies a new economic path for the 21st century, by focusing on five key priorities:
- 1. Fostering a culture of innovation and smart risk-taking in order to become a productivity leader.
- 2. Building a 21st century workforce through workplace training, utilizing newcomers' skills and apprenticeship
- 3. Restoring fiscal balance by improving the way government works.
- 4. Taking advantage of new opportunities in the global economy.
- 5. Identifying, championing and investing in our competitive advan-
