### The President Reports: **GROWING SMALLER AS** YOU GROW LARGER

It has been exciting to watch our church grow since it began eight years ago. We began with just a few people in our living room and have grown to now hundreds of people stretched out over three services in order to fit everyone in. With the growth we have had to adapt and change to best serve in each season.

In the early days we didn't really have to focus much on connecting relationally. There were only a handful of people so it was easy to make sure everybody was well looked after. As we have grown this has become more of a challenge. We have to be intentional so that people don't fall through the cracks, and purposely create an atmosphere where people can find their place to connect and serve.

One of the things we have talked about as a leadership team is the need to grow smaller as we grow



larger. It is easy to remember the goal of growing larger as an organization, but it is often difficult to maintain a sense of connectedness as we do.

To grow smaller means to maintain and deepen the "one on one" and local connections. It means being intentional about building relationships so that you don't lose out on the key things that brought the growth in the first place.

## **PROVINCE: SHIFT RECYCLING ONUS FROM CONSUMERS TO BUSINESSES**

government into the marketplace and will result in a new army of overpaid bureaucrats."

That was the reaction of Flamborough Chamber of Commerce (FCC) Executive Director Arend Kersten when he was briefed on proposed changes to Ontario's recycling program that will shift the responsibility from consumers to business.

During a teleconference hosted by the Ontario Chamber of Commerce (OCC), senior officials from the Ministry of the Environment said the changes will mean an end to eco fees for consumers.

"The proposed waste reduction framework would establish an individual producer responsibility regime where individual producers would be responsible for achieving environmental outcomes set by government on a product by product basis" (emphasis added).

During the OCC teleconference, Kersten also took exception to the Ministry's assertion that the new fees do not constitute a "tax." The proposed legislation "prohibits any false or misleading information with regard to recycling costs (e.g. producers or

"These changes represent a major intrusion by retailers *cannot portray it as a government tax*)" (emphasis added).

"If it quacks like a tax and waddles like a tax and looks like a tax, it probably is a tax," Kersten said.

While emphasizing that neither the FCC nor the OCC has taken an official position on the proposed changes, Kersten shared his concerns at a recent meeting of Ancaster-Dundas-Flamborough-Westdale MPP Ted McMeekin's Environmental Advisory Committee. MPP McMeekin is the Minister of Community and Social Services in the Premier Wynne Cabinet. The featured speaker at the meeting was former McMeekin aide Peter Hargreave who is now the Director for Policy & Strategy at the Ontario Waste Management Association (OWMA). Graham Flint of FORCE (Friends of Rural Communities and the Environment) - the treasurer of the FCC Board of Directors - is a member of the committee.

The proposed changes were presented in the Ontario Legislature just before the summer recess. Kersten - along with the OCC - will continue to monitor the legislation, especially as it relates to real and potential impacts on its members.



## **ROTHSAY INVESTS \$80 MILLION TO PROTECT ENVIRONMEN**

At this year's Outstanding Business Achievement (OBA) awards gala at the Flamborough Hills Golf & Country Club, the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce presented it Green Award to Rothsay and the Community Service by a Company to Boston Pizza. The recipients were introduced by the following citations.

As a member of Maple Leaf Foods Inc., the Rothsay meat rendering plant in Flamborough is deeply committed to the principals of sustainable development in its daily operation: economic sustainability, social responsibility in our community and environmental protection.

Rothsay's goal is to produce quality products for the agri-business and renewable fuels community, while minimizing its environmental impact, reducing waste, conserving energy and other resources and playing an active social role in the communities of Dundas, Flamborough and Hamilton. Rothsay strongly adheres to Maple Leaf Foods' Environment Policy which requires continuous environmental improvement and strong environmental regulatory compliance.

Since 2002, Rothsay/Maple Leaf Foods has invested more than \$80 million in a wide range of environmental and process improvement projects at the Flamborough facility. These include installation of state-of-the-art wastewater treatment and odour control systems and several technologies to reduce energy consumption and its carbon footprint, including a new waste heat recovery system.

Groundwater consumption has been reduced by more than 50% since 1998 and the 3Rs program (reduce, reuse, recycle) for minimizing solid waste generation has been actively expanded through other environmental initiatives Rothsay has completed. More than 80% of the waste generated at the facility is diverted from landfill.

Since starting up the new odour control biofilter in 2003 and our the wastewater treatment plant in 2005, our environmental compliance record has been maintained near 100% and we have virtually eliminated odour from our operations.

Last year the Flamborough plant was awarded a prestigious Tier III environmental award from the American Meat Institute for its environmental management and performance record.

Rothsay is also committed to its social responsibility in our community. Aside from being a major em-ployer and source of economic well-being, Rothsay supports many local community programs through financial donations and hands-on volunteering by our staff.

Rothsay generously contributes annually to the Hamilton Conservation Foundation Outdoor Environmental Education Fund, having donated more than \$100,000 to this initiative.

Two Rothsay/Maple Leaf Foods employees actively support Hamilton Conservation Authority, one as a member of the Hamilton Conservation Foundation's Board of Directors and the other as co-chair on HCA's Low Water Response Team and past judge on the educational Envirothon Competition.

In-house staff fundraisers support a number of other important local functions including the Copetown Lions Club (with \$5,000 donated annually to their underprivileged children programs), local community sports teams and the Rockton 4H Club.
