# HONOURED FOR OUTSTANDING COMMUNITY SERVICE

For outstanding contributions to the community, the Board of Directors of the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce (FCC) decided to present special Civic Recognition Awards at this year's Outstanding Business Achievement (OBA) awards gala to the Flamborough Womens' Resource Centre – a division of Interval House – and the Dundas-Ancaster-Flamborough chapter of Soroptimists International (SIDAF). What follows are the citations presented at the OBA gala before the presentations.

## FLAMBOROUGH WOMEN'S RESOURCE CENTRE

"Finally, we have somewhere to turn to."

That's what Flamborough residents are telling Clare Freeman, the dynamic and visionary executive director of Interval House on the opening of the Flamborough Women's Resource Centre. Here's what Clare had to say as Interval House celebrated its 25th anniversary last year:

"It's hard to believe it has been twenty-five years since we've opened our doors. I remember the passion and inspiration of our founder's vision – to end violence against women by providing a refuge and being the voice for change. We believe, as our founders did, change is possible and it will come from the passion and hard work of those dedicated to make it happen. Our role is to provide more than just a bed."

The program at the Flamborough Women's Resource Centre – a division of Interval House – was built from the ground up, providing for the women of Flamborough and their children vital resources and supports. Community champions like Sandy Gray – then of Weeks Home Hardware of Waterdown; Ward 15 East Flamborough Councillor Judi Partridge; and, Deb Tigchelaar of Drummond House worked miracles to make the Flamborough Women's Resource Centre a reality in Waterdown. Having just completed its first year, the services and the needs are ever growing. The goal is to keep reaching women out into the far corners of the Flamborough communities as well as the thriving towns and Waterdown area.

Over 442 hours of telephone or drop-in information was provided to women in the community. It was heard and learned that affordable housing support and placement continue to be a much-needed service in Flamborough. In addition, the Flamborough Women's Resource Centre has learned from the community that it is requesting more counselling; transitional, legal information and advocacy supports; and, youth supports. The Flamborough Women's Resource Centre has responded to these

requests by providing these services.

Last September, the Flamborough Women's Resource Centre launched its first annual "Ruby Slipper Men's Walk" and it was a huge success, raising over \$20,000!

But the Flamborough Women's Resource Centre is on fiscal life support. Because of changing criteria, it needs to find new sources of financial support. Thanks primarily to the efforts of Councillor Partridge, Hamilton Council has thrown the Flamborough Women's Resource Centre a fiscal lifeline with a \$30,000 grant. But it needs another \$100,000 to survive. Council will consider that request when it conducts its annual budget deliberations. But the outcome is far from certain. (NOTE: Hamilton Council did indeed provide the needed funding during its annual Budget deliberations.)

The Flamborough Chamber of Commerce believes that the very soul of a community is best defined by how it treats its most vulnerable and least fortunate citizens. Interval House and the Flamborough Wo-

men's Resource Centre also subscribe to that principle ... and then walks the talk.

For that, the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce is delighted to present its *Community Recognition Award* to Interval House, with the hope – and expectation – that the Flamborough Women's Resource Centre will also live to see its 25th birthday.

## SOROPTIMISTS INTERNATIONAL Dundas-Ancaster-Flamborough

The Dundas-Ancaster-Flamborough chapter of Soroptimist International – SIDAF for short – is a women's service organization working to help improve the lives of women and girls in our community. The club has grown to 27 members representing women from all aspects of the business world who are enthusiastic about the need to assist women within our own community and throughout the world. Several SIDAF members are from the Flamborough community.

SIDAF raises funds primarily

through a variety of fundraising events held each year. But the club also receives donations from individuals, community grants and grants through Soroptimist International.

Each year SIDAF's Programs Committee reviews requests and provides recommendations to the members on how to distribute the funds raised. Some of the recipients of SIDAF assistance have been the YWCA Encore Program (providing \$35,000 to maintain the program until it becomes self-funded); Wesley Urban Youth Projects – assisting the young women's pod; Drummond House; Interval House; and, Flamborough Women's Resource Centre.

As part of its mandate, SIDAF presents the *Woman's Opportunity Award* to support women who are the head of a household and going to school to further their education and better their life.

Another award – the *Violet Richardson Award* – goes to a female student who is actively involved in volunteering. These recipients are selected through the club's awards committee and some years they have a tough job of making those selections – because there are so many needy and deserving women.

SIDAF assists with donations at Christmas for hampers through the food banks – Flamborough, Dundas (Salvation Army) and Ancaster (Ancaster Community Services). As well, each year it assists the Ancaster Food Drive by packing food boxes.

"Soroptimist International is the world's best kept secret," says the nominator for this award. "For our community and SIDAF, I'd like to see that change."

In recognition of this support for women and children in our three communities, the Flamborough Chamber of Commerce is delighted to present its *Community Recognition Award*.
